

**<u>READING TOP TIP:</u>** Our top tip this week is... MAKE TIME TO READ! Research shows that reading with your child for as little as 10 minutes a day can significantly boost how well they do at school. Set aside a regular time every day to read with your child, whether it's for 10 minutes when they get in from school or reading a bedtime story together. Little and often works best!





HERE TO HELP WITH THE COST OF LIVING: Check you've received all the government's cost-of-living payments. The government's <u>cost-of-living payments</u> are available for those receiving certain benefits or tax credits. You don't need to apply for these - if you're eligible the money should go straight into your account. If you think you're due a payment but haven't received one, <u>report a missing payment</u> to the government. Be **aware of scams!** If you receive any emails, texts or phone calls asking you to fill in an application form or asking for your bank details to receive a cost-of-living payment, do not talk to them or send a reply. You may already have a form of photo ID that is acceptable. You can use any of the following:



- Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country
- Driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state(including a provisional driving licence)
- A Blue Badge
- Older Person's Bus Pass funded by the Government of the UK
- Disabled Person's Bus Pass funded by the Government of the UK
- Oyster 60+ Card funded by the Government of the UK
- Freedom Pass
- Identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)


