CHANGES TO OUR ATTENDANCE POLICY: To bring us in line with other Manchester schools, any families who take holidays during term time, will be issued with a fixed penalty notice of £60.00. Both parents will receive a fine for each child in school. This change in policy will be from September.

READING TOP TIP: Our top tip this week is: **enjoy bedtime stories.** Read with your child at bedtime as often as you can. It's a great way to end the day and to spend valuable time with them. Sharing a book at bedtime helps develop your child's vocabulary, gets them used to the idea of regular reading and gives you both a great opportunity to bond.

Click on [Support for migrant families](#) and use this calculator if you are a migrant family, or if you have no recourse to public funds (meaning you're not entitled to the majority of welfare benefits)

You may be able to get benefits paid early if you need cash urgently - this is known as 'a short-term benefit advance'. You will need to contact the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) office that is handling your claim.

ASSESSMENTS: Congratulations to the Year 6 class for completing their SATS this week and well done also to Year 1 for completing some of their reading and maths assessments. Over the next fortnight, the Year 2 class will be sitting the SATS that they have worked so hard to prepare for. The children in other classes will also undergo some age appropriate assessments and quizzes next week. Please keep the children in your prayers. All this is to inform the teachers and then parents on the amount of progress your child has made since September. It means that next half term, teachers can go over any lessons so that children are ready to go into their next class. Teachers will then celebrate your child's progress in their annual report in July.



'TRIP'LE A CHALLENGE: Has your child come home yet to tell you about the 'Trip'le A Challenge? If not...why not!? Since the start of term, we've been telling the children that the teachers are ever so busy planning end of year trips for them. Of course the children are really excited about this...**BUT**...we have also informed them that they will be invited to attend the trip if they are able to meet our challenge for good **Attendance**, a positive **Attitude** towards their behaviour and **Achieving** to the very best of their ability during their lessons. We know that our parents will support us with this and encourage their children to meet this challenge! 
