

<u>HAPPY BIRTHDAY!</u>: This coming Sunday the Church celebrates Pentecost. This is the feast of the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church - a gift which we now receive at Baptism, Confirmation and at Mass. Pentecost Sunday is popularly known as the birthday of the Church. HERE TO HELP WITH THE COST OF LIVING: Did you know that as many as one million people cut off their broadband in the last year as the cost-of-living crisis left them unable to afford internet access, according to new research from Citizens Advice. People on Universal Credit are among customers who should be eligible for discounted social tariffs to help them stay connected. The latest figures from Ofcom show 95% of the 4.3 million eligible households are missing out on saving £200 on broadband costs each year. That is £824 million of support going unclaimed!! Social tariffs are cheaper broadband and phone packages for people claiming Universal Credit, Pension Credit and some other benefits. Some providers call them 'essential' or 'basic' broadband. They're delivered in the same way as normal packages, just at a lower price. So if you think that you are eligible, just get in touch with your internet provider.





END OF YEAR SCHOOL TRIPS: Parents/carers should have received an email this week from our admin team that outlines the dates and venues of specific trips that have been organised for each year group. All of the end of year school trips have been heavily subsidised by school and, for budgeting purposes, the governors have decided that a reduced cost of £10 will be the cap for every pupil in Years 1-5. The deadline for payments is Friday, 16<sup>th</sup> June on Pay360. The trips promise to be memorable occasions for all of our pupils and thank you to all parents/carers for supporting the staff in school with our 'Trip'le A challenge. As a reminder, pupils will be invited to attend their class trip if they are able to meet our challenge for good Attendance, a positive Attitude towards their behaviour and Achieving to the very best of their ability during their lessons.

<u>YEAR 6 CAMPING TRIP TO NORTH WALES:</u> Parents/carers of Year 6 pupils attending the camping trip to Aberdaron should have received the kit list this week and this should help families to start packing the necessary items. Most families have already started with their payment paln but if any parent/carer is struggling to budget, please call in at the school office and a member of our admin team will help you to set up a payment plan. The next meeting for Year 6 parents will be on Monday, 26<sup>th</sup> June at 3:30 p.m. or 5:00 p.m. Attendance at this meeting is vital and parents will need to bring upto date medical records for their child and emergency contact details.



<u>YEAR 3 EDUCATIONAL VISIT</u>: On Thursday, 22<sup>nd</sup> June the Year 3 children will be enriching their learning for their History topic all about the Romans! They will be visiting a Roman fort in Wrexham and learning about how the forts were built before becoming a Roman soldier and learning to battle in formation. The cost of the trip has been subsidised by school and is capped at £5.00. The deadline for payment is <u>Friday</u>, <u>9<sup>th</sup></u> **June** on Pay360. Parents/carers please look out for a letter by email outlining more details of the visit.

BOARD GAMES: On Tuesday, 6<sup>th</sup> June and Thursday, 8<sup>th</sup> June, some of our teachers are going back to school themselves and will be off-site for some of the day, training. To enable this to happen, we thought we'd take the opportunity to address some of our 9 essential life skills with the children. You will know as parents/carers that children often have difficulty sharing, taking turns, co-operating, encouraging others, being patient, listening to others whilst they play and the big issue of...learning to lose! We would like to invite children on these two days to bring in a board game they have at home which they can play and share with their class-mates. Examples would be: draughts, chess, snakes and ladders or card games. The classrooms on those days will be electronic-free zones! We think this is something the children will really enjoy and benefit from.
