

E-SAFETY TOP TIP: Our top tip this week is: TAKE AN INTEREST IN YOUR CHILD'S ONLINE WORLD

- Find resources to keep your child safe online
- Be honest if you don't understand apps and games they're using, ask them to explain their online world to you
- Tell your child that they can come and talk to you about anything they are experiencing online
- Notice changes in behaviour, as this could be a sign that something may be worng
- Accept that young people will take risks on and offline. However, encourage your child to talk to you even if they make a mistake and think it's too late!
- Be open to what you're being told. Be mindful of the words you use, especiall if you're upset by something negative you discover about your child's online activity
- Most importantly seek help and advice if needed, don't think you must do this alone!

<u>500 WORD STORY:</u> We've already had some chidren engaging with the 500 Words initiative! The UK's most successful children's writing competition has now opened for submissions and will run until Friday, 10th November. Since the competition was first launched in 2011 by Chris Evans on the Radio 2 Breakfast Show, it has received over one million stories from children throughout the UK. This year, the two age categories will be 5-7 year-olds and 8-11 year-olds. Children of all abilities are encouraged to use their creativity and imagination to write a story they would love to read without the pressure of having to worry about spelling, punctuation and grammar. <u>PARENTS' EVENING:</u> Further to the 'Meet the Teacher' meetings in September, parents will have the opportunity to make an individual appointment with their child's class teacher on <u>Tuesday</u>, 17th October. The teachers will be able to report on how well your child has settled in this academic year and discuss individual targets to support your child's progress. A five minute appointment between 3:30-5:15 p.m. can be made and the teachers have been out on the playground after school each day this week to enable parents to make an appointment that is most convenient for them. If any parent has missed their child's class teacher this week then please make a phone call to the office and the staff will be able to slot you in for a suitable time to suit you.





ATTENTION PARENTS: NHS England is urging parents to check that their children are up to date with their MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) vaccinations in the wake of measles cases rising across the country. Childhood vaccination rates have fallen over the past ten years and this week statistics show that over 102,000 children aged four and five years old starting in Reception are not protected against catching measles, mumps and rubella. Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated nine out of ten children in a classroom can catch the disease if just one child is infectious. If you are unsure if you or your child are up to date, check your child's red book or GP records and make an appointment to catch up any missed doses.
