PRIMARY ADMISSIONS 2018-2019

'The ethos of this school is Catholic. The school was founded by the Catholic Church to provide education for children of Catholic families. The school is conducted by its Governing Body as part of the Catholic church in accordance with its Trust Deed and Instrument of Government and seeks at all times to be a witness to Jesus Christ. We ask all parents applying for a place here to respect this ethos and its importance to the school community. This does not affect the right of parents who are not of the faith of this school to apply for, and be considered for, a place here.'

St Patrick's is a Catholic Primary School under the trusteeship of the Diocese of Salford. It is maintained by Manchester Local Authority.

As a Voluntary Aided School, the Governing Body is the Admissions Authority and is responsible for taking decisions on applications for admissions. The co-ordination of admissions arrangements is undertaken by the Local Authority.

Admission to the nursery class at St Patrick's Roman Catholic Primary School will be on either a part time or full time basis. Admission will be made by the Governing Body in accordance with the parental applications subject to the following set of admission criteria forming a priority order where there are more applications for admission than the Nursery has places available. For the school year commencing September 2018 the Governing Body has set its number of admissions at 45 for Nursery 1 and Nursery 2 age group.

The following set of admissions criteria form a priority order where there are more applications for admissions than the school has places available.

1. Baptised Catholic Looked After Children who are in the care of the Local Authority. This includes adopted baptised Catholic children who were previously in the care of the Local Authority.
2. Baptised Catholic children who have a sibling in the school at the time of admission.
3. Baptised Catholic children resident in the boundaries of the parish of St Patrick.
4. Baptised Catholic children from other parishes.
5. Non Catholic Looked After children who are in the care of the Local Authority. This includes adopted children who were previously in the care of the Local Authority.
6. Non Catholic children who have a sibling in the school at the time of admission.
7. Other Non Catholic children.

Please note that length of time on the waiting list is not used as a criterion.

NOTES FOR NURSERY AGE GROUP ADMISSIONS 2018-19

- a. All Looked After Child is a child who is a) in the care of the Local Authority, or b) being provided with accommodation by a Local Authority in the exercise of their Social Services functions (under section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989. A previously Looked After Child is one who immediately moved on from that status after becoming subject to adoption, residence or special guardianship order.
- b. All applicants will be considered at the same time in the Spring term prior to admission. The deadline for applications to be considered by the governing body will be the last day of Spring 1 half term. (February 2018)
- c. All applicants will be required to produce a full Birth Certificate. Children born overseas should also produce a passport.
- d. For a child to be considered as a Roman Catholic evidence of such Baptism will be required.
- e. If, in any category, there are more applications than places available, priority will be given on the basis of age with older children having priority. In the event of birth dates being the same for 2 or more applicants where this would determine the last place/s to be allocated, a random lottery will be carried out in a public place. All the names will be entered into a hat and the required number of names will be drawn out.
- f. Where a child lives with parents with shared responsibility, each for part of a week, the child's "permanent place of residence" will be determined as the address of the parent who normally has responsibility for the majority of school days in a week.
- g. Sibling is defined as a brother or sister, half brother or sister, adopted brother or sister, step brother or sister, or the child of the parent/carer's partner where the child for whom the school place is sought is living in the same family unit at the same address as that sibling. The Governing Body reserves the right to give special consideration to twins or triplets etc to prevent breaking the sibling link. However, the Governing must comply with the maximum class size of 30 children.
- h. The Governing Body reserves the right to withdraw the offer of a school place where false evidence is received in relation to baptism, sibling connections or place of residence.
- i. A waiting list for children who have not been offered a place will be kept and will be ranked according to the Admission Criteria. Parents will be informed if a vacancy subsequently arises.
- j. No appeals may be made against any decision for entry to either Nursery Age Group.
- k. Please note that admission to the Nursery Age Group
 - Does not guarantee a place in the Reception class
 - Does not guarantee a place for brothers and sisters in subsequent years.
