<u>LET'S PRAY:</u> This Sunday we begin to celebrate the season of Advent, a time of waiting and prayer. It's a special time to pause and reflect on the real reason and true meaning of Christmas and give thanks to God for the gift of Jesus to the world. In this Sunday's Gospel, the Master represents Jesus and the servants represent us. The message from the Gospel is very clear: we are to 'stay awake!'.

A little extra daily prayer throughout Advent is a great way to do this - to be alert to Jesus' presence around us. Prayer brings us not only closer to God but also closer to one another. In school, the children have been learning some signing actions to help them to understand the words of The Lord's Prayer, Why not ask your child to teach the family and pray together during Advent?

<u>ONLINE-SAFETY TOP TIP:</u> Our top tip this week is: **KEEP THE LINES OF COMMUNICATION OPEN**.

- It's crucial to talk to your child regularly and openly about what they're doing online
- Encourage your child to tell you if they ever have a problem online. Help them come up with a plan of attack if they ever see anything online that makes them feel worried or unsure (e.g. tell an adult, close the tab, etc.)
- Work together with your child to help them navigate digital dilemmas.
 Reassure your child that you won't take away their devices if issues occur
- Many experts advise against using technology as rewards and punishments. You don't want your child to be discouraged from talking to you about problems due to the fear of being disconnected


