INSPIRATIONAL: In Sunday's Gospel we encounter God through Jesus as the teacher. It's important to have good teachers. Parents are the first and foremost educators of their own children - other family members and friends can also teach about what really matters in life. But who can really teach us about the best way to live? Jesus stood out as a teacher because he taught with authority and power. In this Sunday's Gospel Jesus demonstrates this through the amazing healing of the man in the synagogue. Jesus' teachings expose the things that weaken us - setting free all those who listen to him. The whole of Jesus' life was a continual teaching. His teaching is calm and wise, powerful but gentle, and enriches family life. What an inspiration!

**KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY:** We just can't stress to parents/carers enough about the need to keep school informed if your child is absent for whatever reason. If we don't hear from you, staff will conduct a home visit. If there is no response, we will call 101 and request that police undertake a welfare visit. Please work with us so that we aren't concerned about your child's safety.

<u>URGENT BUILDING REPAIRS:</u> Unfortunately, the planned building work this week didn't go to plan! Storm Jocelyn was to blame on Wednesday and then the builders didn't show up on Thursday! We can only apologise to parents as we know it caused great disruption at the end of the school day. We've been promised they'll start on Monday and it will be for 2 days. The work is to remove and replace the old lead downpipes on the exterior walls. Thank you for your co-operation and understanding.

READING TOP TIP: Our top tip this week is: CHANGE YOUR VOICE FOR EACH CHARACTER. If reading a book aloud with your child, try becoming some or all of the characters in the story! Change your voice for the characters. You can speak in a whisper for a shy mouse. You can speak angrily. You can speak in a loud silly voice. You can speak in a quiet voice. Even when you have only one character, have fun changing your voice. This will make the story more entertaining and help your child understand which characters are talking. As a bonus, you will be helping your child learn new words, such as shyly, angrily, happily, and sadly, because children will match your tone of voice to the words in the book and to the pictures on the pages.



<u>CURRICULUM UPDATES</u>: The children have enjoyed another busy week learning. The Nursery children continued exploring & investigating ice and water. During their Art lesson, Year 4 were examining local architecture and used Tim Garner, a local artist, as their inspiration for their work. Year 3 have caused quite a stir around school this week as they wrote and displayed 'wanted' posters for Big Foot! Year 5 learned about what food Jewish people eat for their festival 'Passover'. HERE TO HELP WITH THE COST OF LIVING-HOUSING COSTS: If you're a tenant, the Universal Credit housing costs element can help towards the cost of your rent and some service charges. If you're a homeowner, you can't get the housing costs element to help with mortgage payments. But you might be able to get help from the government to pay the interest on your mortgage, known as Support for Mortgage Interest (SMI). Whether you want tips on managing your payments, what to do if you fall into rent arrears, or whether an SMI loan is the best option for you, click on the following links to find out more.
