

**READING FOR PLEASURE:** Our reading leaders are going to be out and about talking to children this week about the books they're enjoying from our school book den. Children should bring home an extra book each week which is a book of their own choice and purely for pleasure! We encourage you to share this book with them and read it a few times. Children love to re-read or listen to a story they enjoy.



**CURRICULUM UPDATES:** It's been an absolute joy to have our parents in school again this week for a winter themed stay and play with our youngsters. We hope you gathered lots of ideas for learning through talk & play at home as this will really help with their speech and language! In Y1, in DT this week the children have learned all about umbrellas and parasols. Did you know the first umbrella was invented 2500BC? Year 1 worked incredibly hard to plan, design, make and evaluate their very own umbrellas. They are superstars!



**ON-LINE SAFETY:** Next week, our digital leaders and Mr Eaglestone will be reminding us all about on-line safety. **HEAD LICE:** We ask that all parents undertake a weekly hair health check, particularly with children who have long hair. We've had a number of cases of head lice this half term which isn't pleasant for the children. We'd also like to give a gentle reminder that long hair is supposed to be tied up/back or in braids for this reason.

**FSM VOUCHERS:** Manchester City Council has again approved funding for supermarket vouchers for the February half term break to help with the financial pressures that many of our families will face. Families with children eligible for free school meals (FSM) will receive a £15.00 e-voucher from Wonde on Wednesday, 14<sup>th</sup> February. This voucher can be redeemed at a supermarket of your choice.
