<u>CURRICULUM NEWS</u>: Mr Eaglestone and Year 4 have been exploring what daily life was like for different members of society during the Ancient Greek period. They used I-pads to help them with their research of males, females, children and slaves and presented their findings to the rest of the class. Miss Loughrey and Year 6 have been super scientists this week working on their theme of electricity. They used a variety of electrical components to complete circuits before using the correct symbols to draw the circuits that they had made. Miss Cusick and Year 2 loved their Computing Day on Tuesday. Using a programme called Scratch, they began to understand algorithms and programmed their Scratch characters that they had created to actually move and talk to one another!! <u>ANTI-BULLYING WEEK:</u> Firstly...Anti-Bullying Week will take place next week and it has the theme 'Let's make a noise about bullying.' The week will begin (Monday) and end (Friday) with Odd Socks Day. This year, teachers and children wanted a theme that empowered them to do something positive to counter the harm and hurt that bullying causes. Too often, we are silent when we see bullying take place, silent about the hurt bullying causes, and silent when we hear bullying dismissed as 'just banter'. The children will be learning about how it doesn't have to be this way and how they can make a noise to help it stop.

**<u>PARLIAMENT WEEK</u>**: As well as that, we have Parliament Week in the UK. The children will be getting involved in lots of fun activities designed to engage and inform them about the importance of Parliament in the UK and why it is important to live in a democratic society where everyone has an opportunity to express their opinions. The KS2 classes will be putting democracy into practise as they elect 2 members of their class to represent their voices as part of the JLT (Junior Leadership Team).





**ASSESSMENT WEEK**: And to top it all off... all of the children in Year 2-6 will complete their start of year assessments next week and these will provide the teachers with further information to support them with planning future lessons. Please continue to encourage your child at home with their homework, weekly spellings, Mathletics, TTRS, Numbots and of course reading on a daily basis for at least 15 minutes.
