CURRICULUM NEWS: As always we've had a busy week with our learning and we're delighted to report that our children have really engaged. Mrs Durcan, Miss Aulton and Year 5 have been listening and appraising Motown during their music lesson this week. They have studied the words from Marvin Gaye's "I heard it through the grapevine." During their educational visit on Monday, Miss McEwan, Miss Corcoran and the Year 3 children were archaeologists for the morning and dug up some artefacts from the Stone Age using special tools that archaeologists use. Miss Cusick and Year 2 have been learning all about bees in their English lessons and have learnt to use expression when reading poems about bees aloud. 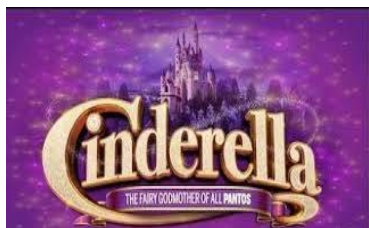

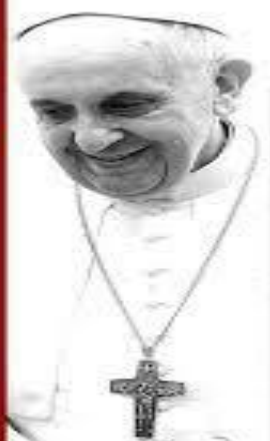
