ENCOUNTERING CHRIST: In this Sunday's Gospel, we read about the first disciples. As John stood with two of his disciples, Jesus passed, and John stared hard at him and said, "Look, there is the lamb of God." Hearing this, the two disciples followed Jesus. Jesus turned round, saw them following and said, "What do you want?" They answered, "Rabbi," - which means Teacher - "where do you live?" "Come and see," he replied; so they went and saw where he lived, and stayed with him the rest of that day. It was about the tenth hour. One of these two who became followers of Jesus after hearing what John had said was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter. Early next morning, Andrew met his brother and said to him "We have found the Messiah" - which means the Christ - and he took Simon to Jesus. Jesus looked hard at him and said, "You are Simon son of John; you are to be called Cephas" - meaning Rock.

<u>BEHAVIOUR RE-SET:</u> With the new year and a fresh start in mind, on Monday, staff reviewed our school behaviour policy and culture. As we evaluated, we also celebrated just how well our children understand and meet our high standards on a daily basis. As you're aware, our policy is underpinned by our Gospel Values which are by no means easy to follow. Over the next few weeks, we'll be working with our JLT (Junior Leadership Team) and

children to review our child friendly policy. The House Captains are raring to go and we wonder who'll be celebrating on 'Fantastic Friday' mid February. We encourage parents to come and ask staff in school at the end of each day to find out just how well your child is doing with managing their own behaviour because we think they're pretty fantastic!

<u>ATTENDANCE MATTERS</u>: Many of our children will be coming home wearing their attendance stickers with pride! So many reached our target of 97% and some even exceeded it, achieving 100%. We do hope those children who were poorly before Christmas have better health this term. Some top tips to help:

- Get enough sleep a minimum of 8 hours is required for children of Primary school age
- Wrap up warm during the winter months hats, gloves & scarves are a great help
- Eat well eat those fruit and vegetables and you'll have a better chance to fight off germs
