


WEEKEND MASSES - Come to the table, everyone is welcome!

## Welcome back to the glorious season of Easter! Alleluía, Alleluía!

**BELIEVE:** In this Sunday's Gospel, we read that the disciples were gathered in a room. They had locked the doors because they were afraid of the people who had crucified Jesus. Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" and he showed them the wounds in his hands and his side. Thomas, one of the disciples, was not there when Jesus came and he refused to believe what had happened. One week later, they were in the room again, and Thomas was also there. Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" Then he said to Thomas, "Here, touch the marks on my hands and feel the wound in my side. Doubt no longer, but believe." **<u>READING TOP TIP</u>**: Most children will be out of the habit of reading due to the Easter break. Our top tip this week is: **TAKE BREAKS WHILST READING**. Your child doesn't have to read an entire book in one go! Any time spent sharing or talking about a book is beneficial, even if it's just a couple of minutes at a time. If they have to close the book early because it's time for tea, or they're just losing interest, that's okay. Reading can take a lot of mental energy and taking breaks gives children a chance to slowly build the mental stamina they need, so that soon they will be able to read for longer stretches of time.
