Each school was invited to bring a cross featuring a photograph of every child, so although only a few pupils could attend in person, every child was represented and there in spirit. The procession has been a fixture in the Ancoats community for over a century and is a cherished tradition. We are delighted that our Parish will be walking and everyone is invited. It's a very special day so do come along and join in the fun!
